3. AGENDA REVIEW

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES - September 9, 2021

Steve Weiss moved to approve the September minutes and Maggie Bird seconded the motion. Robert Trimborn and Steve Tannehill abstained. All other Commissioners voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously 6-0.

6. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. <u>Subject</u>: Approval of, and Authorization for the Director of Airports or His Designee to Sign, the Second Amendment to the Lease with RKR Incorporated to Defer Rent Payments for 12 Months and to Provide for Use of County's Water Credits

Recommendation:

Staff requests that your Commission/Authority recommend that the Board of Supervisors (Board):

Approve, and authorize the Director of Airports or his designee to sign, the second Amendment to the Lease with RKR Incorporated (RKR) at the Camarillo Airport to defer rent payments for 12 months and to allow RKR to use County-owned water credits to obtain a water will-serve letter from the City of Camarillo.

Interim Director Dave Nafie introduced the item and provided staff's report. Mr. Nafie stated that this item is related to the CloudNine project. The County of Ventura requires a water and sewer will-serve before a building permit can be issued. RKR is required to obtain water and sewer permits from the City of Camarillo. RKR is also required to obtain an encroachment permit for Las Posas Road from the City. All three requirements need to be satisfied before the City will take the matter before Camarillo City Council. The Department of Airports is assisting RKR by helping them meet the requirements of the City's water offset credit program. The department is allowing RKR to use 1.43 water credits and in return, RKR would restore 2.15 credits within 24 months. Additionally, RKR has requested that the department defer rent for a 12 month period. The original terms of RKR's lease otherwise remain unchanged. In response to a question posed by Commissioner Steve Tannheill, Mr. Nafie shared that if RKR is unable to restore the department's water credits as agreed, RKR will provide the department fee title to a parcel of land that is interior to the airport.

Steve Weiss moved to approve staff's recommendation and Adriana Van der Graaf seconded the motion. All Commissioners voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously 8-0.

B. <u>Subject</u>: Adoption of a Resolution Authorizing Remote Teleconference Meetings of the Aviation Advisory Commission for a 30-Day Period

Recommendation:

Adopt the attached Resolution (Exhibit 1) authorizing remote teleconference meetings of the Aviation Advisory Commission for a 30-day period pursuant to Government Code Section 54953, Subdivision (e), of the Ralph M. Brown Act.

Interim Director Dave Nafie introduced the item and provided staff's report. Mr. Nafie explained that conditions have been met under Assembly Bill 361 for the Commission to continue to meet virtually. In order to continue remote teleconference meetings, the Commission must consider and make findings outlined in the Resolution every 30 days by majority vote. Adoption of the proposed Resolution authorizes the Commission to meet remotely for a 30-day period.

Adriana Van der Graaf moved to approve staff's recommendation and Steve Weiss seconded the motion. All Commissioners voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously 8-0.

7. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Interim Director Dave Nafie provided an update on the Oxnard Airport runway and taxiway reconstruction project. Paving began on September 20, 2021 and construction will conclude on November 4, 2021. The runway is expected to reopen on November 5, 2021. Mr. Nafie congratulated the Camarillo Wings Association for being awarded Service Organization of the Year by West Ventura County Business Alliance.

Mr. Nafie shared that in terms of community outreach, he made a presentation to the Channel Islands Neighborhood Council at their last meeting and shared information about the airports. Mr. Nafie continues to work with the tower at Oxnard Airport to discuss traffic patterns, safety, and noise. He also shared that he spoke to Faviola Garcia with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to discuss these issues. The department will also add educational information to the website.

Regarding the 1976 Joint Powers Agreement, the City of Camarillo and the County of Ventura are preparing a slate of questions to submit to the FAA. In regard to the airport director position, Mr. Nafie passed along that County Executive Officer Mike Powers indicated that there should be an announcement in the next week or two. Finally, Mr. Nafie reported back on an action item requested by Commissioner Steve Weiss regarding the California Department of Fish and Wildlife lease which was an item before the Commission at the September meeting.

Meetings of the Aviation Advisory Commission for a 30-Day Period

Recommendation:

Adopt the attached Resolution #2 (Exhibit 1) authorizing remote teleconference meetings of the Aviation Advisory Commission for a 30-day period pursuant to Government Code Section 54953, Subdivision (e), of the Ralph M. Brown Act.

Fiscal/Mandates Impact:

There are no fiscal impacts associated with this action.

Discussion:

Governor Gavin Newsom signed Assembly Bill 361 ("AB 361") into law on September 16, 2021. AB 361 is an urgency measure effective immediately that authorizes legislative bodies to meet remotely in any of three circumstances, as set forth in Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e):

- "The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency, and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing." (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(1)(A).)
- "The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees." (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(1)(B).)
- "The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and has determined, by majority vote, pursuant to subparagraph (B), that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees." (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(1)(C).)

AAC Adoption of Resolution #2 Authorizing Remote Teleconference Meetings November 1, 2021 Page 2

Governor Newsom declared a State of Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic on March 4, 2020. Dr. Robert Levin, Ventura County Health Officer, issued a recommendation regarding social distancing and continued remote meetings of legislative bodies on September 21, 2021. Dr. Levin's recommendation states in part, "I strongly recommend that physical/social distancing measures continue to be practiced throughout our Ventura County communities to minimize the spread of COVID-19, including at meetings of the Board of Supervisors and meetings of other legislative bodies of the County of Ventura."

Airport staff ensures that all virtual meetings are held in compliance with the Government Code as it relates to posting requirements, public accessibility to the meeting, and public comments. Although your Commission, as a legislative body in the County, may continue to meet virtually, to do so, your Commission must now make the following findings by majority vote every 30 days:

- Your Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency, and
- One or both of the following circumstances exist:
 - The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of your Commission's members to meet safely in person, or
 - State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. (Gov. Code, § 54953(e)(3).)

Attached for consideration is Resolution #2, that if adopted, authorizes your Commission to meet remotely for a 30-day period. Additionally, if Resolution #2 is approved, a Special Meeting will be held remotely on Monday, November 15, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. to consider adoption of Resolution #3, which will allow the Commission meeting scheduled on Monday, December 6, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. to be held remotely within a 30-day period, if chosen.

RESOLUTION #2 OF THE AVIATION ADVISORY COMMISSION AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE AVIATION ADVISORY COMMISSION FOR A 30-DAY PERIOD PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953, SUBDIVISION (e), OF THE RALPH M. BROWN ACT

WHEREAS, the County of Ventura ("County") is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Aviation Advisory Commission ("Commission");

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e), of the Brown Act, authorizes the legislative body of a local agency to use remote teleconferencing in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953, subdivision (b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions;

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558;

WHEREAS, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing;

WHEREAS, such conditions now exist in Ventura County, specifically, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic on March 4, 2020 ("State of Emergency");

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2021, Dr. Robert Levin, Ventura County Health Officer, issued a recommendation to continue practicing social distancing measures throughout Ventura County communities, including to continue to implement 100 percent remote meetings of all legislative bodies in Ventura County, to prevent and minimize the spread of COVID-19 ("Recommendation to Promote Social Distancing");

WHEREAS, the Commission does hereby find that it has reconsidered the circumstances of the State of Emergency, the State of Emergency remains active and continues to directly impact the ability of its members and attendees to meet safely in person, and that the Ventura County Health Officer, Dr. Robert Levin, continues to recommend measures to promote social distancing to minimize the spread of COVID-19 including that all legislative bodies in Ventura County continue to meet remotely, as further explained in his Recommendation to Promote Social Distancing, which has not been rescinded and remains in effect;

WHEREAS, the Commission does hereby find that it shall conduct its meetings without compliance with Government Code section 54953, subdivision (b)(3), as authorized by subdivision (e), of Government Code section 54953, and that the

Commission shall comply with the requirements set forth in Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e)(2); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Commission as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Staff supporting the Commission are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including conducting open and public meetings of the Commission in accordance with Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e), and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until the earlier of (i) December 1, 2021, or such time the Commission adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953, subdivision (e)(3), to extend the time during which the Commission may continue to teleconference without compliance with Government Code section 54953, subdivision (b)(3).







CAMARILLO AIRPORT – AIRPORT MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Note: Per direction from airport staff, the Consultant has been advised to pause the master plan as of May 25, 2021. Certain elements related to the AGIS and environmental surveys will still be moving forward as they relate to information needed for FAA coordination and other project needs outside the master plan study process.

Status Update:

- Tasks associated with the AGIS survey continue. Most recently, data associated with the obstruction survey and airspace analysis is being compiled. Edits are also being made to survey mapping for FAA compliance.
- Environmental survey reports associated with biological and cultural resource evaluations are in progress.

Project Percent Complete: The project is 41 percent complete through September 2021.

CAMARILLO AIRPORT – AIRFIELD GEOMETRY AND DRAINAGE STUDY Status Update:

- Based on coordinated between the Consultant and airport staff in September, an exhibit has been prepared that depicts potential airfield geometry enhancements for further input into the airfield
 - "Draft" aviation demand forecasts have been prepared and were coordinated with airport staff on July 5, 2019. The current master plan will re-evaluate aviation demand forecasts for input into this study.
 - On-site surveying has been conducted by a Subconsultant for further input in the airfield drainage study.

Upcoming Action Items:

drainage study.

- Coordination as needed with airport staff and the FAA to determine course of action in relationship to master plan process and future design.
- Recommended airfield drainage enhancements pending the drainage study.

Project Percent Complete: The project is 41 percent complete through September 2021.

OXNARD AIRPORT – AIRPORT LAYOUT PLAN UPDATE / NARRATIVE REPORT Status Update: No change since July 2021.

- The "draft" Narrative Report, "draft" ALP Drawing Set, and associated ALP SOP 2.00 Checklist and Exhibit A SOP 3.00 Checklist were re-submitted to the FAA for review on July 26, 2021.
- The FAA provided comments to airport staff on October 13, 2021, regarding the draft ALP Drawing Set.

Upcoming Action Items:

Transfer of historical water use from 500 Eubanks Street to RKR, Inc.

(CloudNine Project) located at 111, 113, 115, and 117 Las Posas Rd,

Camarillo, CA 93010

Mr. Klotzle,

A building owned by the County of Ventura located at Camarillo Airport, 500 Eubanks Street, Camarillo, was demolished in October 2017. The demolished building had a historical 10-year average annual water use of 6.678 AFY. A portion (0.76 AFY) of the historic potable water use was transferred to the Airport's N.E. Hangar Project – Phase I when it received water improvements engineering approval in 2019. Thus, the County of Ventura retains a water demand offset balance of 5.918 AFY.

The County of Ventura Department of Airports authorizes the transfer of 1.43 AFY of its balance to RKR, Inc. for offsetting water demand at the subject project site. Following the transfer, the resulting County of Ventura Department of Airports water demand offset balance will be 4.488 AFY.

Through an amendment to its lease, RKR, Inc. has agreed to make qualifying improvements within the City of Camarillo to offset a total of 2.15 AFY within the following 24 months. At that time, the City of Camarillo will be asked to recognize the transfer of 2.15 AFY water demand offset from RKR, Inc. to the County of Ventura Department of Airports. The water transfer satisfies the water demand offset as required by City of Camarillo's Municipal Code Ordinance (Chapter 14.12).


