Oxnard Airport Authority: Public Member Eugene Fussell moved to approve staff's recommendations and Councilmember Bert Perello seconded the motion. All members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously 5-0.

I. <u>Subject</u>: Receive and File Report on Potential Development of Two Aviation Parcels at Oxnard Airport

Recommendation:

Staff requests that your Commission/Authority recommend that the Board of Supervisors (Board):

Receive and file a report on potential development of a 5-acre parcel by Fly 805, LLC, and a 7-acre parcel by Urban Air Mobility, LLC, at the Oxnard Airport.

Lease Manager Madeline Herrle provided staff's report.

Oxnard Airport Authority: Councilmember Bert Perello moved to approve staff's recommendation and Councilmember Vianey Lopez seconded the motion. All members voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously 5-0.

7. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- Staff met with COHOTA's leadership in August in regard to the new private hangar leases and seven of the board members have agreed to be the test group with hangar inspections and the change over to the new rental agreement. The process will start in September and with 220 members to go through the expectation is that it will run through the middle of next year.
- On September 1st the FAA approved GAMI unleaded fuel. Staff expects the progress and migration from leaded aviation fuel to non-leaded fuel to take some time. The new fuel has to start being manufactured in large volumes and then transported to all airports, which will take time.
- Staff continues to work with the vendor on the security camera systems for both airports. The systems for both airports are expected to be in place sometime at the end of the year.
- In regard to noise concerns, the new PIO is in place. A Fly Friendly kickoff program is scheduled for next Tuesday at the Oxnard Airport. 35 flight schools from the LA basin have been invited to come talk about noise, pass out the information we have and what we're looking for them to do. This is just the beginning, just the start to really push that out to those pilots and flight schools that use our airports. Part 150 noise studies are also in place.
- The Wings Over Camarillo Air Show at Camarillo Airport was successful once again on August 20th and 21st. Last year they had a record attendance of 16,000 people and they broke that record again this year with 20,000 attendees.
- The Cloud Nine project continues to progress at Camarillo and is still looking at the second quarter of 2023 to open their doors.
- The Coulson fire helicopter is based in Camarillo, but also spent some time last month at Oxnard Airport. This was paid for by the local power company to be in place to protect the County. The helicopter arrived in July and we expect it to be at one of the two airports through the end of the year.
- Recognition of the Experimental Aircraft Association Chapter 723 based at Camarillo Airport that was recognized for 30 consecutive years of the young eagles program where pilots donate their time, their airplanes and fly kids ages 8 to 17 for free. Staff had a discussion with an EAA member from Oxnard Airport that is looking to restart the program at the Oxnard Airport this year.
- The Airports' Department is working with the CEO's office and County General Services Agency because Oxnard Airport has been selected as a site to install three

electric vehicle charging stations, another one of the SCE programs for the installation.

10. AUTHORITY COMMENTS

Councilmember Bert Perello voiced his appreciation for the meeting tonight, the questions, the dialogue back and forth, and that the Authority allowed recognition of Sara Wan and all the good works she did including teaching Supervisor Carmen Ramirez a lot of the issues about the environment. Regarding the topic about people teaching young kids how to fly, he mentioned that there is a picture of a gentleman by the name of Mr. Buddy Gibson in the front of today's Star. Mr. Perello has been able to be involved with this gentleman with respect to the group that flies out of the Bethel Amy Church with, basically, the Tuskegee Airmen and teaching young kids and what a tremendous story it is.

As a City Councilman in Oxnard, Councilmember Perello thanked Mr. Freitas and his assistant, Mr. Nafie for attending the City Council and making a presentation. He also apologized for there being some technical difficulties and mentioned that he has been assured that all the technical difficulties have been addressed and the tape and the revisiting of the meeting is 100 percent up to snuff. Councilmember Perello commented on the pleasure it was after all these years to have a presentation by the Airport Authority in Oxnard. He hopes that in the future they can have some of the Authority meetings out of Oxnard, since they're a joint use Camarillo-Oxnard. He appreciated the presentation

that was made, the dialogue, and the points that Mr. Nafie brought up. One point specifically that Councilmember Perello asked about was the difference in the length of the runways which Mr. Nafie explained is 50 feet and he also explained the weight that can be carried in the runways. Councilmember Perello thought Mr. Nafie did a great job and thanked both of them for coming to Oxnard.

Supervisor Kelly Long wanted to make sure everyone was aware of the great presentation that morning at 7:30 from Mr. Freitas about how great the airport is, what we're working on and the opportunities to work with the cities, the college districts, and the Navy base with regard to building a workforce for our community. Ms. Long voiced her appreciation for their time and efforts there, and also for presentations to the City of Camarillo and City of Oxnard, to really collaborate and make our airports as robust as possible and ensure that the community is linked into what's going on. Supervisor Long discussed the shared concern in regard to noise, and some airplanes flying last week or so, and she appreciated the opportunity to talk about that and to share the information with our community. She thought it was good teamwork and wanted to say thank you.

Chair Vianey Lopez agreed with Supervisor Long's comments and talked about how great it was to see the presence of the airport and department throughout the community and being a partner with our cities, even if it's just Oxnard and Camarillo who have airports under jurisdiction. She commented on how great it was to build those relationships and have that line of communication throughout the community. Chair Lopez thanked staff for all their work and efforts, especially with the late meeting on Tuesday and the early day today.

There being no further business, the September 8, 2022 Camarillo Airport Authority and Oxnard Airport Authority meeting adjourned was at 9:11 p.m. in memory of Supervisor Carmen Ramirez and Ms. Sara Wan, two great women who leave an incredible impact in our community and who will be kept in great memory for their presence and leadership.
